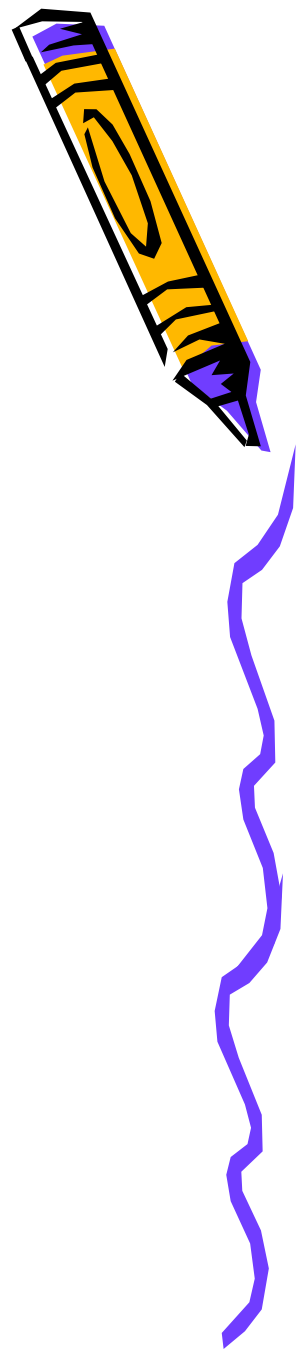

Computing – Computer Science, Digital Literacy, Information Technology.

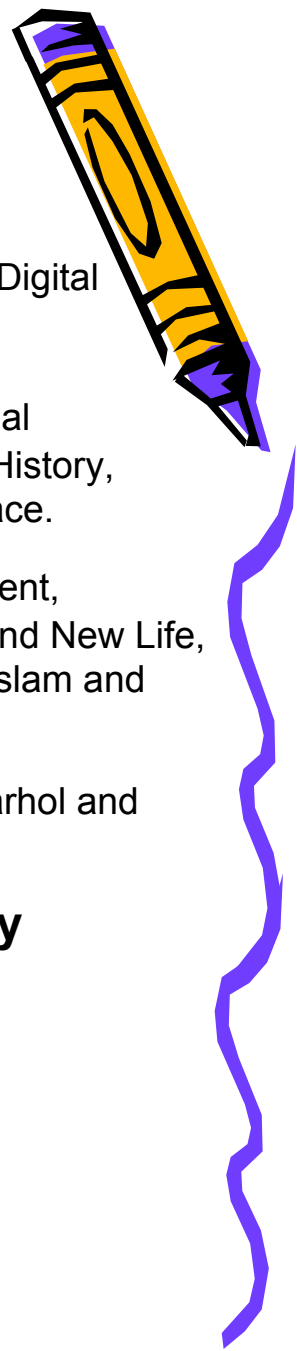
Creative Curriculum – Industrial Revolution, Mayan Civilisation, Local History, Climate Change, Amazon and Our Place.

- ✓ Remember to bring homework to school EVERY DAY!

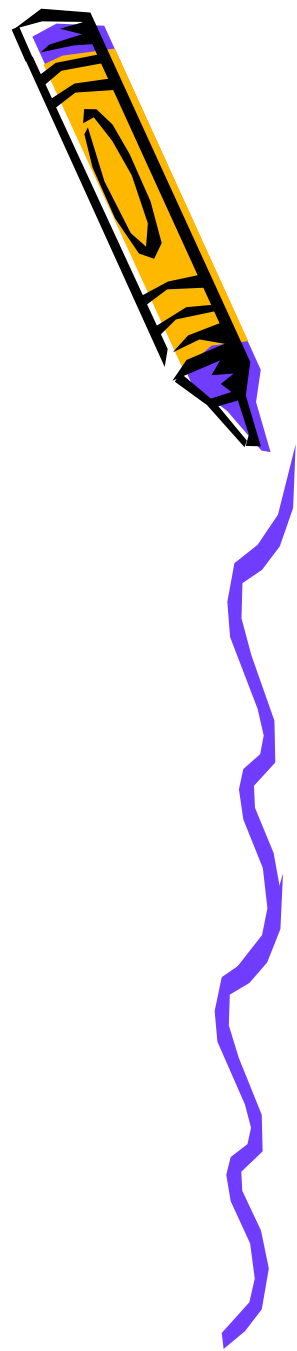


Equipment

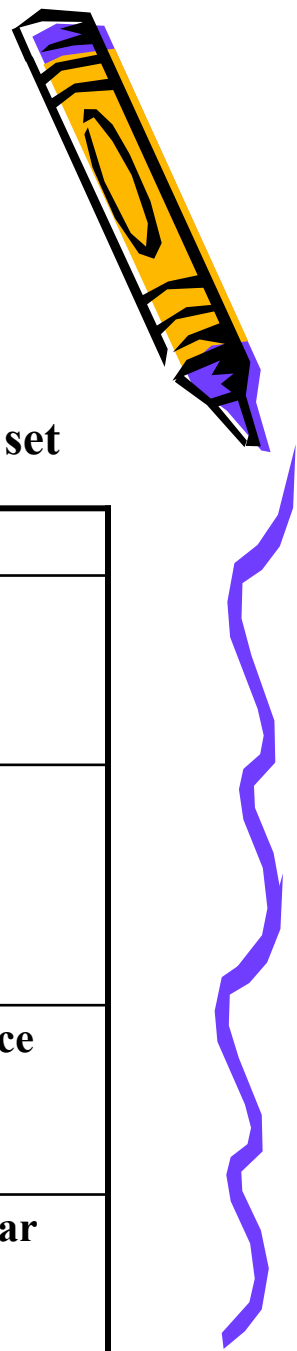
Your child will require the following stationery for the coming year.

Your child will be set approximately 90 minutes of homework from Monday to Thursday. We also expect the children to read every day. **All homework will be set online.**

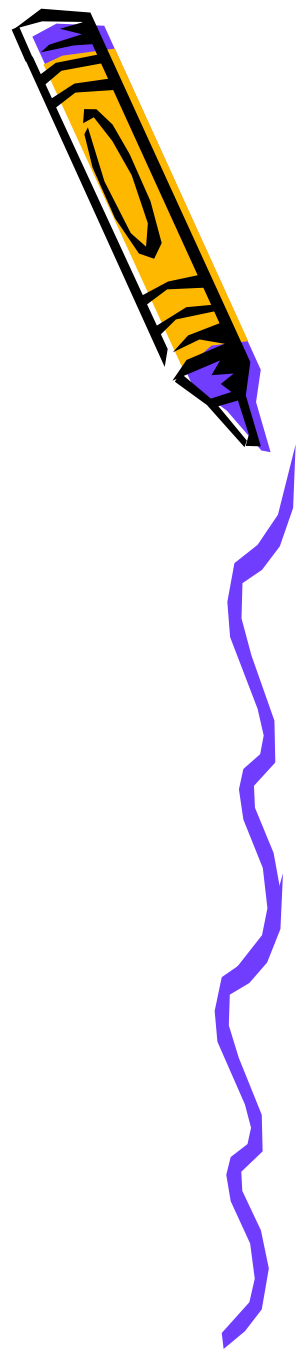
Monday-Thursday:

During the Summer Term, Year 6 will sit SATs exams in Maths and English.

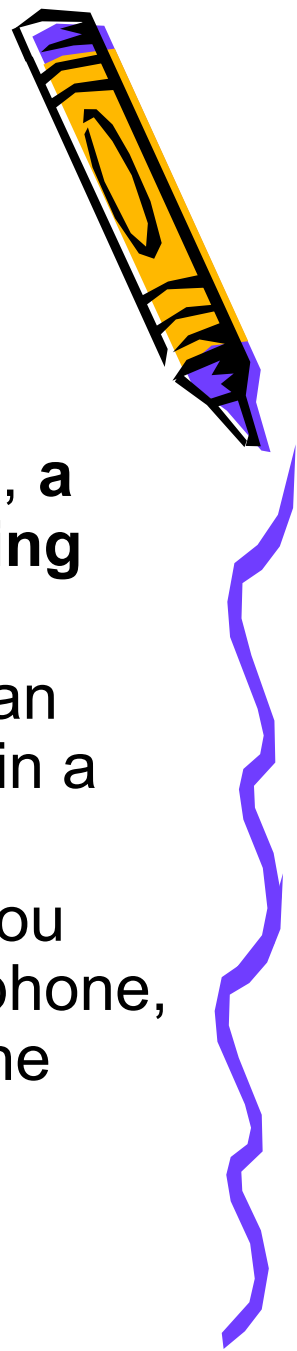
There will be multiple practice papers for the children to feel comfortable with the content and the structure of tests.

This plan may be subject to change in line with Government Guidelines.

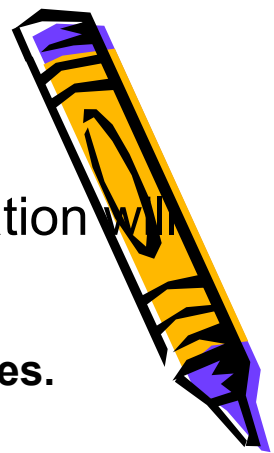
The trip will take place:

Monday 13th June – Friday 17th June

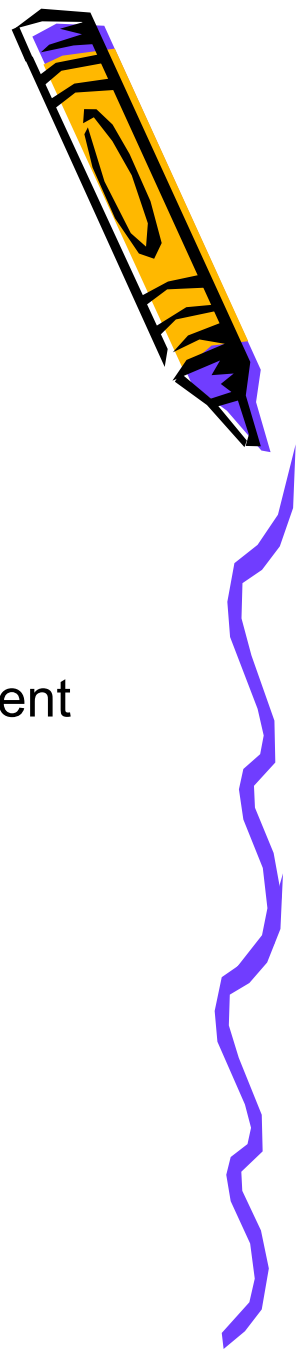
Osmington Bay, PGL
