




Year 3 & 4 Curriculum Meeting

Independence

Religious Education Linking School, Home and Parish

<u>Year 4 - People</u>

This topic explores the truth that Jesus had a natural family with real people with names and a history.

The Primary Curriculum English

- Emphasis on Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling with specific word lists for Year Groups.
- · To be able to recite and perform some poems by heart.
- Focus on the writing process: self-evaluating, drafting editing and writing at greater length, to develop "stamina" for writing through longer compositions.
 - Joined up handwriting should become the norm; pupils should be able to use it fast enough to keep pace with what they want to say.

The Maths Curriculum

General:

There is high expectation overall.

Maths Curriculum:

- There are early and challenging requirements for multiplication tables and fractions.
- There is emphasis on the use of large numbers at an earlier age.
- There is a focus on counting beyond whole numbers, e.g. decimals, fractions.
- Data handling has decreased, but the curriculum makes more reference to interpretation of data.

Subjects

English:

Stories with familiar settings, non-chronological reports, instructions, poetry.

Mathematics:

Counting and understanding number, understanding shape, addition, subtraction, and multiplication and division.
