Subjects

English:

Classic fiction, modern fiction, reports and recounts, instructions and explanations, poetry.

Mathematics:

Place value up to 6-digit numbers, decimals and fractions, addition and subtraction, up to 5-digit numbers, multiplication and division, measure and data.

Science:

Current - Earth and Space Next - Animals including humans

Religious Education: Ourselves

P.S.H.E - Health and wellbeing

Geography: What is life like in the Alps? Next - Why do oceans matter?

History: What was life like in Tudor England? Next - What did the Greeks ever do for us?

Art/DT: Drawing and design. Next -Painting and mixed media

Computing: E-Safety. Next – Computing Systems

Music, Singing, P.E. and Italian

The Primary Curriculum

English

•Emphasis on Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling with specific word lists

•Focus on structure and purpose of the writing. Writing to suit a purpose with a growing awareness of audiences, for example using humour and suspense. Organising writing into sections or paragraphs and creating cohesion by linking ideas within paragraphs. Evaluating their own and others' writing, including proof reading, editing and revising.

> •Joined handwriting should become increasingly legible and fluent. The correct choice should be made about whether to join handwriting or print letters e.g. to label a diagram.

The Maths Curriculum

The main areas covered are multiplication, division and fractions.

Less coverage of addition and subtraction, number and place value.

- High expectations including presentation
- Number and Place Value order and compare numbers to at least 1 000 000, read roman numerals up to 1000 (M)
- Addition and Subtraction adding and subtracting whole numbers with more than 4 digits
- Multiplication and Division factors and prime numbers
- Fractions decimal and percentage equivalents
- Measures metric and imperial units
- Geometry Properties of Shapes and Position and Movement
- Statistics reading and interpreting information in tables

Homework and Expectations

Your child will be set approximately 30-40 minutes of homework from Monday to Thursday.

However, we do expect the children to read over the weekend.

•15-20 mins daily reading
