Objectives/Outcomes of PPG spending
<p><i>Objectives in spending PPG:</i></p> <p>At Joseph's, we are dedicated to providing quality teaching and learning opportunities to meet the needs of all pupils, particularly vulnerable and disadvantaged pupils.</p> <p>The Pupil Premium funding we receive is used to ensure that all disadvantaged children are supported in making progress towards meeting or exceeding age related expectations. This progress is continually monitored and reviewed and funding and resources targeted effectively to help accelerate progress and close gaps in learning.</p> <p>Our main aims are to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Close any gaps in attainment for disadvantaged pupils, compared to their non-disadvantaged peers, in all subjects 2. Maintain high expectations and standards for pupils eligible for Pupil Premium 3. Ensure all pupils are given the same opportunities to develop their potential and participate fully in extra- curricular activities in and outside of school
<p><i>How the money was spent in 2021/22</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ One to one tuition for Years 4,5 and 6 pupils eligible for pupil premium who were at risk of not meeting the expected standard in Maths at the end of KS2 – Third Space Learning ➤ Contribution to Psychotherapy support for individual vulnerable pupils, provided by Anna Freud Centre. ➤ Financial support for disadvantaged children to access school trips and after school clubs. ➤ English & maths booster classes for pupils in Years 1,2,3, 4,5 and 6 ➤ Support Staff– All classes, from Nursery to Year 6, to have a teaching assistant which is over and above standard pupil to teacher ratio to support identified children and deliver additional interventions where needed. ➤ School uniform and equipment for pupils ➤ New guided reading books for all children, workbooks for disadvantaged children where extra resources would help. ➤ Specialist additional support from external providers – e.g. Dyslexia support and Art Therapy <p>TOTAL: £45,730</p>

Our pupils eligible for the PP continue to achieve well at the end of KS2 when compared to their PP peers nationally and all pupils nationally. In July 2022, our PP pupils' attainment was

- In line with their peers for Reading, Slightly above for Reading and Writing.

- One to one tuition for Years 5 and 6 pupils eligible for pupil premium who were at risk of not meeting the expected standard in Maths at the end of KS2 – Third Space Learning. Although this has been successful in the past, the quality of adult interactions has declined. So we have decided to take a more targeted approach using our own staff through booster classes.
- One to one reading support to enable pupils to make progress towards end of year/key stage expectations. Our collaboration with Beanstalk is positive and children respond well, this will continue.
- Psychotherapy support for individual vulnerable pupils. This spend to remain, more families have been helped post Covid
- Financial support for disadvantaged children to access out of school activities such as residential trips workshops and outings in all year groups. An increase is expected in light of the difficult circumstances we find ourselves in.
- English & maths booster classes for pupils in Years 1 to 6. Continue and extend to younger children and Ukrainian refugees.
- Support Staff– All classes, from Nursery to Year 6, to have a teaching assistant which is over and above standard pupil to teacher ratio to support identified children and deliver additional interventions where needed. Continue to subsidise this item.
- All PPM children to receive books from visiting authors Continue, particularly in light of the cost of living crisis.
- Uniform and school equipment on a point of need basis. Continue, and again an increase is expected here.
- All children to be offered two after school clubs each term. Continue, these continue to be successful, with a view to ensuring every child has an equal opportunity to succeed.
- Art therapy, specialist provision – e.g. Dyslexia support, literacy support. Continue and expand, this is even more important with some of our Ukrainian refugee children

Total of £57,448. This amount does not cover all of the above, therefore charitable donations, contributions from Governors' Fund and from delegated budget supplement these costs.
