

<b>Objectives/Outcomes of PPG spending 2018/19</b>
<p><b>Objectives in spending PPG:</b></p> <p>At Joseph's, we are dedicated to providing quality teaching and learning opportunities to meet the needs of all pupils, particularly vulnerable and disadvantaged pupils.</p> <p>The Pupil Premium funding we receive is used to ensure that all disadvantaged children are supported in making progress towards meeting or exceeding age related expectations. This progress is continually monitored and reviewed and funding and resources targeted effectively to help accelerate progress and close gaps in learning.</p> <p>Our main aims are to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Close any gaps in attainment for disadvantaged pupils, compared to their non-disadvantaged peers, in all subjects</li> <li>2. Maintain high expectations and standards for pupils eligible for Pupil Premium</li> <li>3. Ensure all pupils are given the same opportunities to develop their potential and participate fully in extra- curricular activities in and outside of school</li> </ol>
<p><b>How the money was spent in 2021/22</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ One to one tuition for Years 4,5 and 6 pupils eligible for pupil premium who were at risk of not meeting the expected standard in Maths at the end of KS2 – Third Space Learning</li> <li>➤ Contribution to Psychotherapy support for individual vulnerable pupils, provided by Anna Freud Centre.</li> <li>➤ Financial support for disadvantaged children to access school trips and after school clubs.</li> <li>➤ English &amp; maths booster classes for pupils in Years 3, 4,5 and 6</li> <li>➤ Support Staff– All classes, from Nursery to Year 6, to have a teaching assistant which is over and above standard pupil to teacher ratio to support identified children and deliver additional interventions where needed.</li> <li>➤ School uniform and equipment for pupils</li> <li>➤ Workbooks for children across the school during lockdown</li> <li>➤ New guided reading books for all children.</li> <li>➤ Specialist additional support from external providers – e.g. Dyslexia support and Art Therapy</li> </ul> <p><b>TOTAL: £45,730</b></p>

combined

- **Significantly above their non PP peers and non PP peers**

#### Plans for Pupil Premium expenditure 2021/2022

- One to one tuition for Years 5 and 6 pupils eligible for pupil premium who were at risk of not meeting the expected standard in Maths at the end of KS2 – Third Space Learning
- One to one reading support to enable pupils to make progress towards end of year/key stage expectations
- Psychotherapy support for individual vulnerable pupils
- Financial support for disadvantaged children to access out of school activities such as residential trips workshops and outings in all year groups
- English & maths booster classes for pupils in Years 1 to 6
- Support Staff– All classes, from Nursery to Year 6, to have a teaching assistant which is over and above standard pupil to teacher ratio to support identified children and deliver additional interventions where needed.
- All PPM children to receive books from visiting authors
- Uniform and school equipment on a point of need basis
- All children to be offered two after school clubs each term
- Art therapy, specialist provision – e.g. Dyslexia support
