Objectives/Outcomes of PPG spending 2019/2020
<p><i>Objectives in spending PPG:</i></p> <p>At Joseph's, we are dedicated to providing quality teaching and learning opportunities to meet the needs of all pupils, particularly vulnerable and disadvantaged pupils.</p> <p>The Pupil Premium funding we receive is used to ensure that all disadvantaged children are supported in making progress towards meeting or exceeding age related expectations. This progress is continually monitored and reviewed and funding and resources targeted effectively to help accelerate progress and close gaps in learning.</p> <p>Our main aims are to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Close any gaps in attainment for disadvantaged pupils, compared to their non-disadvantaged peers, in all subjects 2. Maintain high expectations and standards for pupils eligible for Pupil Premium 3. Ensure all pupils are given the same opportunities to develop their potential and participate fully in extra- curricular activities in and outside of school

How the money was spent;

- Provide one to one tuition for Year 5 and 6 pupils eligible for pupil premium who were at risk of not meeting the expected standard in Maths at the end of KS2 **Third Space Learning £7794**
- Provide one to one reading support to enable pupils to make progress towards end of year/key stage expectations **Beanstalk, £1320**
- Psychotherapy support for individual vulnerable pupils **Anna Freud £5133**
- Financial support for disadvantaged children to access out of school activities such as residential trips in Years 5 and 6 and after school clubs **£2300**
- English & maths booster classes for pupil in Years 3 to 6 **Class teachers £7256**
- Employing an additional teacher support to provide enriching learning experiences **£26,252**

Total spend: £50,055

Plans for Pupil Premium expenditure 2020/2021

Continue to provide

- One to one tuition for Year 5 and 6 pupils eligible for pupil premium who were at risk of not meeting the expected standard in Maths at the end of KS2
- One to one reading support to enable pupils to make progress towards end of year/key stage expectations including Phonics Screening Check
- Psychotherapy support for individual vulnerable pupils and to develop support packages for children who have been affected by COVID
- Financial support for disadvantaged children to access out of school activities such as residential trips in Year 5 and 6 and after school clubs
- English & maths booster classes for pupil in Years 3 to 6
- An additional 0.5 teacher support to maintain the low pupil teacher ratio in Reception (taught in two classes with a maximum teacher pupil ratio of 1:21
- In case of further lockdowns, ensure devices are available for children to access learning at home.
