This progress is continually monitored and reviewed and funding and resources targeted effectively to help accelerate progress and close gaps in learning.</p> <p>Our main aims are to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Close any gaps in attainment for disadvantaged pupils, compared to their non-disadvantaged peers, in all subjects 2. Maintain high expectations and standards for pupils eligible for Pupil Premium 3. Ensure all pupils are given the same opportunities to develop their potential and participate fully in extra- curricular activities in and outside of school

Our pupils eligible for the PP continue to achieve well at the end of KS2 when compared to their PP peers nationally and all pupils nationally. In 2019 our PP pupils' attainment was

- **Significantly above** their PP and non PP peers nationally in reading
- **Significantly above** their PP and non PP peers nationally in writing
- **Significantly above** their PP and non PP peers nationally in maths
- **In line** with their non PP peers in school in all three subjects in reading, writing & maths combined
- **Significantly above their non PP peers and non PP peers nationally**
